

Chairman's Corner

Welcome to the Autumn edition of the Staffordshire Knot. The major holiday season is now over, and I expect many of you have been helping your children look after the grand children over the school holidays [not long until Half Term!!!!].

Des and I had one of our regular meetings with the Chief Constable at Police Headquarters Weston Road Stafford on 13/8/2018.

Topics we discussed were: -

1. The on-going Injury on Duty Reviews. There seems to be an *impasse*, at the moment, between the Force and some IOD recipients. The Chief Constable is considering implementing Regulation 33 against, possibly, 20 persons who he perceives have not complied with the process. Those IOD recipients take an opposite view, stating that they have complied. We await the outcome of the Chief Constables decision. The progress of reviews appears to be stayed whilst the Force appoints a new Selected Medical Practitioner.

2. The Staffordshire crime figures and the current restructuring of the Force. The Chief Constable is hopeful that following the Force restructuring the crime figures will improve. [Continued]...

3. We asked if he and his Chief Constable colleagues were actively lobbying the Home Office and the Treasury for more resources for the Police. He confirmed that they were.

4. We discussed the Police and Crime Commissioner's take-over of the back-office functions of Staffordshire Fire and Rescue Service. He was generally supportive of this move, believing that it may free up more resources for Policing. He did accept that it would create a lot more work for the Police and Crime Commissioner's Office as his remit expanded.

Police Treatment Centres

As mentioned previously in my updates, the Force, Police Federation, and Staffordshire NARPO were considering moving from affiliation to the Police Treatment Centre at Goring [Flint House] to the Police Treatment Centre at Harrogate. It became apparent that serving and retired officers could get a better deal by moving to Harrogate. At the last Force Welfare Meeting on 4/9/2018, the decision was taken by all to move to Harrogate. A brochure informing retired officers on how to subscribe is reproduced at pages 9 and 10. If retired officers wish to subscribe they will pay a minimum £2.81 per month. However, Harrogate have stated that if retirees sign up by the **17th of December 2018** then the usual 12 months waiting period for entitlement will be waived. Normally you would have to subscribe for 12 months before being able to access Harrogate's services. ***Do not miss this special offer.*** Please consider making donations above the suggested minimum, and taxpayers, do **Gift Aid** your donations, as this boosts the charities funds in tax rebates to the Centre. One further condition, you need to subscribe to the Force Welfare Fund. If you previously ceased membership, you will be allowed to rejoin to access PTC services with contributions of 65p a month.

NARPO Conference held at Torquay on 7/9/2018

The NARPO Conference took place in Torquay, it was a low -key affair this year as there were no motions to debate. I perceive that Conference was motion exhausted, after two years of motions attempting to get the new rules accepted by the Country. Updates were given concerning the progress of several campaigns that NARPO, with other agencies are engaged with [i.e. Later Life Ambitions and Widows Pensions for Life].

The main speaker at the Conference this year was Ann Widdecombe, she was both humorous and informative, and it was apparent that she is very supportive of extra funding for the Police Service.

From the Archive

Marchington Air Disaster, Sunday 19/8/1984

At 0932 hours on Sunday 19/8/1984 a Vickers Varsity aircraft, belonging to the Leicester Aircraft Preservation Society took off from East Midlands Airport. It had travelled to East Midlands Airport from RAF Syerston, Nottinghamshire, its planned destination being Liverpool Airport.

There were 14 occupants on the aircraft which included two crew. Flying alongside of the Vickers Varsity was a Cessna 180, whose mission was to record the flight of the Vickers Varsity and take accompanying aerial photographs.

The Vickers Varsity made a series of orbits of the Blithfield Reservoir in Staffordshire, and during this time it was noticed that puffs of smoke and loud bangs were being emitted from the left engine. The photographic session continued, and the pilot of then noticed that the right engine had started to backfire as well.

At 1005 hours the Varsity pilot called East Midlands Airport requesting a direct return to the Airport owing to the engine problems and possibly having to declare an emergency.

East Midlands Control gave them immediate permission to return to the Airport. The Varsity continued to lose height and at 1007 hours the co-pilot of the Varsity radioed "we're going to have to put down in the nearest field, we are down to 400 feet and losing power on both engines, so we are going into the". [Continued]...

The undercarriage of the Varsity was lowered and at a very low height, the left wing was then seen to drop and the aircraft rolled over, the nose dropped and it crashed inverted. Just before the impact the left mainplane severed a 11,000 volts electricity supply wires.

As the aircraft broke- up on impact, the rear part of the fuselage together with the tail plane fell into a drainage ditch, some 10 feet deep. The aircraft burst into flames, three persons who were seated in the rearward facing seats in this part of the fuselage were able to escape one suffered a broken leg and received severe burns.

All the other persons onboard were unfortunately killed.

The Air Accident report stated that the probable cause of the accident was loss of control when the aircraft stalled at low altitude while the pilot was attempting a forced landing following a progressive loss of power on both engines.

This aircraft entered service with the RAF in 1952, registered WJ897 and was retired from service in 1974. Its role was a training aircraft for pilots and trainer for bombing runs. It was powered by two Bristol Hercules 264 turbo prop engines. It was assigned the civil registration mark G-BDFT

N.B. As a point of interest whilst I was a Police Cadet in 1968/69 The Staffordshire Police Cadets did a week exchange with RAF Cosford. During this time, we had a flight in a Vickers Varsity which was based there. Today, Cosford Air Museum has a Vickers Varsity on display. I am not sure if this is the one we had a flight on all those years ago.

STAFFORDSHIRE OFFICERS – HOW TO MAINTAIN YOUR ELIGIBILITY FOR TREATMENT IN RETIREMENT FOR JUST £0.65 PER WEEK!

Retired Officers are welcome for treatment at our Centres in Harrogate and Auchterarder. Both Centres have been significantly improved in the last two years, and the standard and quality of the treatment and facilities is better than ever. Last year we treated 311 retirees on a residential basis.

We are pleased to say that, due to the special circumstances involved, **until 17th December 2018** all retired Staffordshire officers are eligible to sign up as donors to the PTC, without having made payroll donations either to Flint House or the PTC when in service.

After 17th December 2017, the normal rules will apply whereby if you were donating in service and then seamlessly begin paying your Retired Officer donations you will be able to apply for treatment immediately at the PTC without waiting. However, if you were not previously a donor during service, you will have to pay your retired officer donations for 12 months before being able to apply for treatment.



Signing up is easy. Simply complete a direct debit form, which you can find on the PTC website at www.thepolicetreatmentcentres.org or ring us on **01423 504448** and ask for one to be sent out to you. ***Please be sure to get your application submitted by the offer closing date.***

For just £0.65 per week (or minimum monthly £2.81) you can then apply for treatment at our class-leading facilities. Subject to clinical assessment you will be offered a one week stay, Sunday to Sunday.

Bob Hopkinson, a retired Derbyshire Officer recently came to Harrogate for treatment:

“As our Force has only last year joined the PTC I took up the option to attend St Andrews for a week’s intensive physiotherapy after shoulder surgery.

As you walk into the centre, there is an air of calm. There is a nice relaxed feel to the place and all the staff are warm, friendly and very helpful. The facilities available are first rate and the programme that I was given was adapted to suit my own recovery. You can get involved as much as you feel able.

I retired several years ago but made contributions throughout my service and beyond, treating them as an investment. They have really paid dividends.

Despite the current economic climate where finances are stretched, serving or retired, I would strongly urge you to consider making contributions to the fund for what may prove to be very worthwhile treatment. You never know when you may need to cash in. “
